ENTRY LIMITS & LATE ENTRIES

Space is limited to 100 entries. Early entry is advised. Entries by Thursday, 12th January, please. Late entries may be accepted but will incur a late entry fee of £5. Entries on the day will incur a £10 surcharge.

WITHDRAWAL

A player may withdraw at any point up to the closing of normal entries on Thursday, 12th January, subject to a £5 administration fee. Withdrawal after this forfeits the full entry fee.

QUALIFYING

You can qualify for the 2023 EJCOA Finals:

- By winning your age-limited section in a Zonal tournament. One boy and one girl will qualify from the Under 8, U10, U12, U14, U16, U18 & U20 categories in each Zonal. You can play in multiple Zonals tournaments to attempt to qualify.
- By rating. Any player with an ECF or FIDE standard play rating above a specified age related threshold qualifies automatically. See the EJCOA website for details.
- Wild Card entries. These players will be invited by the EJCOA Selection Committee, based on:
 - Performance in an EJCOA Zonal
